## **PURPOSE:**

To define the Central DuPage Hospital Emergency Medical Services (CDHEMSS) policy for initial licensing of an EMS Lead Instructor

## **POLICY:**

- 1. To apply to for the EMS Lead Instructor's license, the candidate shall submit
  - a. Documentation of experience and education in EMS.
  - b. The required fee as set by IDPH in the form of a money order or certified check made payable to the Department (cash or a personal check will not be accepted)
  - c. An EMS Lead Instructor application form prescribed by the Department, which shall include, but not be limited to, name, address, and resume.
- 2. An EMS Lead Instructor shall meet at least the following minimum experience and education requirements:
  - a. A current license as an EMT, EMT-I, Paramedic, RN or physician;
  - b. A minimum of two years of experience in pre-hospital emergency care;
  - c. At least one years of documented teaching experience;
  - d. Documented classroom teaching experience, i.e., BTLS, PHTLS, CPR, Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS);
  - e. Documented successful completion of the NAEMSE Educators Course or equivalent to the National Standard Curriculum for EMS Instructors.
- 3. Upon the applicant's completion of the EMS Lead Instructor examination with a score of at least 80 percent, the Department will approve the individual as an EMS Lead Instructor. The approval will be valid for four years.
- 4. Lead Instructors shall attend a Department-approved curriculum review course whenever revisions are made to the National Standard Curricula for EMR, EMT, Advanced EMT, and/or Paramedic.
- 5. The Department shall, in accordance with Section 515.160 of the Illinois EMS Act, suspend or revoke the approval of an EMS Lead Instructor, after an opportunity for a hearing, when findings show the EMS Lead Instructor has failed:
  - **a.** To conduct a course in accordance with the curriculum prescribed by the Act
